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The National Center for Biblical Parenting began in the 90s and, now, with over 400 trained coaches and 150 trained presenters, the message of a heart-based approach to parenting is impacting families and churches all over the world. Dr. Turansky and Mrs. Miller have written 15 books on parenting, created 5 video small group courses, and lead a team of teachers and coaches to help churches develop their Parent Discipleship Programs and teach parents how to work with the heart.

Parents outside the church learn about the parent training resources available (i.e. court mandated parent education, foster and adoptive parent education, and help for traditional and non-traditional families).


WE USE A BIBLICAL APPROACH




